### English for University Studies I

#### Unit 1, People, Passion, Possibilities

#### Objectives:

1. To try to capture the excitement of students starting their university life; and by building on this excitement, help them to extend their English. They discuss topics which students embarking on a new stage of their life at a university are hopefully awake to, concerning intellectual curiosity and receptiveness to new ideas...

## A Framework for Task-Based Learning (Willis, 1996)

In this framework, which we have adapted to our university context, a thematic focus provides a context for tasks, which usually require small group collaboration and discussion, and are central to the course approach.

In each task cycle, a five-stage sequence, students attempt the task using the language they already have at their disposal: Pre-task activities  $\rightarrow$  The Task  $\rightarrow$  Academic Literacy Focus  $\rightarrow$  Language Focus  $\rightarrow$  Follow-up Task.

As students do the task, teachers notice aspects of their performance that indicate a gap in their language or skill repertoire. It is only after the task that teachers help students to bridge this gap.
